Grace Machanic recently lost her husband, **Roger**, after a long struggle with Alzheimer's disease. He was a very successful Old Town developer, and they both lived in Alexandria. Roger supported Grace in her numerous commitments at the theatre for many years and often attended performances here as well.

Michael Toomey also supported the theatre in many ways over the years, particularly in catering double tech dinners and other social events at the theatre. His wife, **Mary Beth Smith-Toomey**, has been just about everywhere, including producing dozens and dozens of shows at the theatre and serving on the Board of Governors. We will always miss Michael and his many contributions.

Allan Stuhl lost his wife, Jean, recently after a series of illnesses. Both Allan and Jean have made important contributions to the theatre for many years. Their support of LTA has been significant in numerous departments. In particular, Jean served for an extended period as the Executive Secretary on the Board of Governors.

One of our members was bigger than life – and that is, of course, **Roland Branford Gomez**. There are so many areas in which Roland made contributions that once again, it's just easier to say "everywhere" rather than try to list them. He was truly a star not only at LTA, but also throughout the D.C. metropolitan theatre community. Roland was the Governor for Education on the Board of Governors at the time of his passing.

We could fill up an entire issue of our newsletter if we attempted to list all of the contributions that these fine people have made. Rather than do that, I just want to acknowledge their contributions and tell their families and friends how much we appreciate them and that they will truly be missed. It is concerning and disturbing for us to lose those who have been such an integral part of the organization, yet we must look forward and help to make the theatre grow into the future with new talent and ever-broadening opportunities to meet the artistic needs of the community and thus to ensure the legacy of those who have left us. I myself am on the upper side of the general age group of members and volunteers at The Little Theatre, and these losses remind me to encourage the upcoming group of younger people by mentoring someone when I see the opportunity, and by making the theatre experience at LTA of interest to our millennials.

Our organization is very dynamic, and we are always trying to get younger volunteers and members to participate in our productions and in many of the other activities throughout the theatre. We have been very successful in many of these attempts. One of our efforts has been to organize a Millennial Committee comprised of younger members who would support activities that address the needs of a younger audience and volunteer base. Let's allow this to serve as an invitation for all of our members to do the same – to reach out to younger members in our community to encourage their involvement at LTA.

We will always remember all those many members who are no longer with us who have made significant contributions to our success.

Upcoming Auditions

The Little Theatre of Alexandria is proud to present the timeless holiday classic *A Christmas Carol*. This production is sure to put you in the holiday spirit.

Roles include 11 men, 7 women, and 9 children and teens. Two roles may be played by a man or a woman. All ethnicities are welcome. Some actors will play more than one character.

Actors may be required to play various roles and should be comfortable with some dancing and singing, as both will be required throughout the show. If you have specific jazz or ballet background, please so indicate on your audition form.

For the Audition

Auditionees are strongly encouraged to request an appointment time.

To request an audition time, send an email to producer Russell Wyland (<u>RussellWyland@gmail.com</u>) and state your preferred audition date and time. You will receive confirmation of your audition date and time within a day or two; a reminder message will be sent to you two days before your appointment. Auditions are scheduled every 20 minutes beginning at 7:00 p.m. on Fridays and 2:00 p.m. on Saturdays; the director will read approximately 18 auditionees per hour. *There will be no Sunday evening auditions for this production*.

If an appointment cannot be arranged, you may "walk in" and be seen at the first available opportunity.

Please print out the audition form on the LTA website, complete it, and bring it with you. If you have a headshot and acting resume, please bring them with you. All those auditioning will be asked to have their picture taken by the LTA photographer. Auditions will consist of readings and monologue improvisation. All materials will be available at the audition table (not in advance). You are also requested to prepare 16 bars of a Christmas song or traditional carol. If possible, please bring accompanying sheet music. Dancing/movement auditions will be a part of callbacks only.

Charged with the overall responsibility of running the theatre, the Board of Governors continues to meet on the third Wednesday of each month. Below are some of the issues that have been on the agenda for the past two months.

• Upon the request of the Virginia Department of Taxation, a financial review is ongoing and is being conducted by an independent CPA. The results of the review should be available in the near future.

Your Board of Governors at Work

- Michael Page, our camp director, just completed a very successful summer camp season for which we had a record attendance. We thank him and all of those who helped with the camp.
- We continue to work towards scheduling additional CPR/AED training classes, which will be complimentary for LTA members.
- Our Business Manager, Virginia Lacey, has announced her pending resignation as she plans to relocate to South Carolina. Our Box Office Manager, Tina McCrea, applied for the position, and the Board of Governors approved this transfer. We are now in the process of collecting résumés for the position of Box Office Manager.
- Representatives of the board have been in touch with city representatives on the issue of the Ramsey House Project. Regarding this matter, there have been issues that might affect our ability to access our off-site storage garages. As of this date, it does not appear to be a problem.
- With a lot of new members coming into the theatre, our Governor for Front of House (FOH), **Jean Coyle**, has been receiving numerous requests for house manager and usher orientation. We are very thankful for our FOH volunteers.
- Our Millennial Committee had a cabaret following the matinee performance of *West Side Story* on Sunday, July 31st, that was very successful.
- Our Governor for Public Relations, **Rachel Alberts**, is working with our graphic designer to completely update the LTA website in the fall.
- We have a large machine backstage called a Genie. This is like a small car and has a "cherry picker" deck on it that elevates so that we can get up into the area over the stage for hanging lights and rigging. Our Governor for Technical Support, **Robert Kraus**, had a maintenance checkup done on the Genie, and it is guaranteed to be in top-notch order.
- We are blessed to have an extensive costume closet (located in the basement below the shop area). Our Governor for Artistic Support, **Beverley Benda**, informed the board that her team of volunteers had cleaned out the costume closet and discarded 98 bags of old costumes. Even with this culling, we still have the most extensive costume closet of any community theater in the area.
- At long last, the accessible ramp project has been completed. Our Governor for Building, **David Hale**, announced the completion, and everyone agreed that it is a very successful addition to our building and a great asset to our patrons with special needs.
- The Director of the LTA Council, **Carolyn Winters**, has been working with our Building Committee on a project to improve the appearance of our patio area. They are planning to install an informal Shakespearean garden within the next several months. They are also planning to install honorary/memorial bricks on the patio. These bricks can be purchased by patrons who want to remember someone special.
- Our recent production of *West Side Story* came in at 100% attendance. Many thanks to the cast, crew, director, and producers for a fabulous sold out show!

Governor's Message Artistic Support

LTA's "Team Artistic Support" is comprised of ten AMAZING volunteers who throughout the year corral the thousands of items which appear on the LTA stage as costumes, props, wigs, and set dressing. These ten chairmen – Annie Vroom and Kevin Lane (Costume Closet), Bobbie Herbst and Nicole Zuchetto (Props Closet), Susan Boyd and Ashley Amidon (Wigs & Makeup), Eddy Parker and Judy Kee (Off-Site Garages) – have done the heavy lifting in their areas for many years, and this year we added Kit Sibley and Jean Schlichting to the team in a new area: Wardrobe. Not only does each two-chairman team manage and inventory all items in their specific areas throughout the year, they also schedule and carry out semi-annual clean-outs to purge numerous unnecessary and damaged items from our coffers to allow more space to store new and upgraded pieces. These chairmen also assist outside theaters who have little to no inventory of their own in borrowing LTA's assets for their own productions, making our theater a "community" theater in every way possible.

Just this past July, a group of 24 volunteers – comprised of chairmen from all areas of Artistic Support, volunteers from the organization One Brick, and numerous volunteers from other theaters grateful for our lending policies – purged the LTA Costume Closet of 93 (!!) large black garbage bags of costume items that we no longer have use or space for – and be assured, we have plenty of costume pieces remaining for numerous future productions!

Sadly, Artistic Support lost three of its long-standing chairmen this summer. Costume Chairmen Annie Vroom and Kevin Lane have moved on to other endeavors, while Off-Site Storage Chairman Eddy Parker has moved to the other end of the country. The entire area of Artistic Support, myself included, is so sorry to bid farewell to these dedicated volunteers who have spent so much time upgrading and safeguarding our production assets and their storage spaces, while creating a lending system that really works in LTA's favor. I can never thank them enough for all they have done for our theatre and for me.

That being said, Artistic Support now has VACANCIES! I am looking for some enthusiastic, able-bodied volunteers who would be interested in taking on the responsibilities established by these three chairmen – millenials are welcome! If you are looking to get more involved in LTA on a dream team that supports every show and is vital to and appreciated by all members of LTA, please contact me through our Business Office. I would love to chat about the possibility of your joining our team. There are always two chairmen in each area to share the light load and, of course, I take up the slack when needed. The simple procedures have already been established; they only need chairmen to carry them out as necessary.
